Travel Recommendations to OXYGEN EVENT - NOOD, La Défense, Paris

For those attending the **OXYGEN EVENT - NOOD** at **2 Esp du Général de Gaulle, 92400 Puteaux, La Défense, Paris,** here are some travel options to help you arrive smoothly:

From Charles de Gaulle International Airport (CDG):

•By Train (RER B + RER A): From CDG, take RER B (direction Paris) to Châtelet-Les-Halles. At Châtelet, transfer to RER A (direction La Défense) and exit at La Défense station. From there, it's a 10-minute walk to the venue. The total journey time is around 1 hour and 15 minutes.

From Orly International Airport (ORY):

•By Train (Orlyval + RER B + RER A): Take Orlyval light rail to Antony station, then transfer to RER B (direction Paris) to Châtelet-Les-Halles, where you'll switch to RER A (direction La Défense). Exit at La Défense station and it's a short walk to the venue. This journey takes about 1 hour.

From Gare du Nord (Train Station):

•By RER A: At Gare du Nord, take RER A (direction La Défense) directly to La Défense station. The journey takes about 15-20 minutes. From there, it's a 10-minute walk to 2 Esp du Général de Gaulle, Puteaux.

From Gare de Lyon (Train Station):

•By RER A: Take RER A (direction La Défense) directly to La Défense station. The journey takes about 25 minutes, with a fare of around €2. Once at La Défense, it's a 10-minute walk to the venue.

Isabellle Job Bazille

Chief Economist at Crédit Agricole S.A. since February 2013 Isabelle Job-Bazille began her career with Paribas in 1997 as a country risk analyst for the Middle-East-Africa region. She joined Crédit Agricole S.A. in September 2000 as an economist specialising in Japan and Asia before being appointed head of the Macroeconomics division in May 2005. From 2007 to 2011, she worked with Crédit Agricole Corporate and Investment Bank's Capital Markets Research teams, first in Paris and then in London, whilst continuing her responsibilities within Crédit Agricole S.A.

Isabelle Job-Bazille holds a doctorate in Economics from the University of Paris X Nanterre.

Marjolaine Meynier-Millefert is a French politician affiliated with Renaissance (formerly La République En Marche!). She represented Isère's 10th constituency in the National Assembly from 2017 to 2024. She began her career as an English teacher and later founded a communication company catering to small and medium-sized enterprises. She was elected to the regional council of Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes. In 2016, she joined La République En Marche! and was elected to the National Assembly in 2017. During her tenure, she specialized in energy renovation policies and was appointed rapporteur of the Commission of Inquiry on renewable energies in 2019. She also represented the National Assembly in the Higher Council for Building and Energy Efficiency. In March 2021, she became president of Alliance HQE-GBC, a non-profit association promoting sustainable construction.

Jan Kadijk is Program manager Knowledge and Innovation at the Dutch Green Building Council (DGBC), where he is working on climate adaptation, biodiversity and social impact in the built environment. As a human geographer he had a career in urban planning, housing and mapmaking, mainly from a bottom-up perspective. His recent work in on the Framework fo Climate Adaptive Buildings, an open standard that addresses physical climate risk at the building level.

Sakina Pen Point is is an expert in adapting buildings to climate change. With a Master 2 in Air and Ocean Physics and Chemistry and an MSc in Climate Change and Development, she began organizing events in 2015 to raise awareness of climate change solutions, alongside COP21. Passionate about teaching, she designs innovative teaching tools. She then joined the Observatoire de l'Immobilier Durable where she developed and managed the Climate Change Adaptation Department and BAT-ADAPT, a climate risk assessment tool. Now Project Director at Cerema, she coordinates adaptation strategies for buildings in the face of climate risks. Her role involves coordinating projects aimed at anticipating and responding to climate challenges such as heat waves, clay shrink-swell phenomena and other climate related risks. Its approach is based on the identification and promotion of passive solutions, as well as adaptation of nature based solutions, including revegetation and the use of bio-and geo sourced materials.

Carlo Battisti is the President of Living Future Europe and Executive Director for Europe at the International Living Future Institute. He holds a degree in Civil Engineering from the Politecnico di Milano and brings over 20 years of experience in construction and sustainable innovation. Carlo coordinated international projects aimed at boosting sustainability, including initiatives to enhance indoor air quality in schools. As Chair of a major European research network, he brought together experts to drive a paradigm shift towards restorative sustainability. As Executive Director and President, he leads groundbreaking challenge projects that conventional sustainability standards. A highlight of his work is the Buildings and Districts Renovation initiative under the Horizon Europe program. Carlo is committed to developing solutions that foster thriving ecological and social systems. His vision is a regenerative Europe where innovative design and construction promote both well-being and environmental harmony.

Christine Guinebretière is the CEO and co-founder of Upcyclea, a leading platform for circular economy and decarbonization in real estate. With over 20 years of experience in environmental strategy, she helps asset owners turn buildings into material banks, reducing embodied carbon and unlocking new financial value.

Under her leadership, Upcyclea developed the first Al-powered building passport, enabling material tracking, reuse, and ESG compliance with CSRD, EPBD, and AGEC. A recognized expert in low-carbon innovation, Christine is committed to making the built environment more sustainable, circular, and profitable.

Stefan Moser was born in Munich in 1971 and trained as an economist and a lawyer. He joined the European Commission in 2000 in DG Competition to work on control of state aid to public undertakings and services, notably financial institutions. From 2005 to 2009, he worked in DG Environment on climate and environment policy, notably greenhouse gas emissions trading, transport emissions and air quality. From 2009 to 2025, he dealt with policy coordination in the Secretariat General, in particular on climate, energy, environment, transport, agriculture and maritime policies. From 2025 onwards, he has served as head of unit in DG Energy, first on energy security and safety, and then on energy efficiency of buildings and products.

loannis Tsakiris is **Vice-President of the European Investment Bank (EIB)** and has built a distinguished career at the intersection of public investment, financial instruments, and sustainable development. From July 2019 to June 2023, he served as Deputy Minister for Development and Investments in Greece, where he oversaw the management of the country's €7 billion annual Public Investment Programme and €22 billion in European Structural and Investment Funds. During his tenure, he played a pivotal role in setting up the Hellenic Development Bank and its investment branch, steering billions in assets to stimulate Greece's economy and private investment landscape. He also led negotiations for Greece's €26 billion EU structural fund programme and contributed to the design of the country's Recovery and Resilience Facility plan.

Before his ministerial role, Mr. Tsakiris spent over a decade at the European Investment Fund (EIF), part of the EIB Group, where he held senior leadership positions, including Head of the Southeastern Europe and EU Neighbouring Countries Division. There, he focused on enhancing SME access to finance, developing national financing tools, and expanding EIF operations into new markets. His expertise extends to private equity, venture capital, and sustainable finance, reflected in his leadership roles at the Global Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy Fund and other prominent investment committees. Complementing his financial leadership, Mr. Tsakiris has also shared his knowledge as a lecturer at the University of Luxembourg, teaching risk capital and finance. With a strong academic background in engineering, metallurgy, and finance, his career demonstrates a unique blend of technical expertise and strategic vision, making him a key figure in shaping Europe's financial and sustainable investment landscape.
